The U.S. Naval Academy Class of 1978 presents this Honor Challenge Coin to our Another Link in the Chain, the Class of 2028. It is uniquely designed for the Class of '28 and represents a physical reminder of your commitment to the U.S. Naval Academy Honor Concept and our Core Values.

front back

- The circular shape of the coin is a common symbol for infinity because it has no beginning or end. Just like this infinite circle, '78's commitment to '28 is never-ending.
- The two stars at the top on both sides represent the Classes of '78 & '28. The four stars at the bottom represent the four years at the Naval Academy and the Class of '78's four, four-star Admirals.
- Both sides display the unbroken chain representing our long-standing naval history, traditions and legacy.
- The front displays the Naval Academy Crest and Navy's three Core Values: Honor, Courage and Commitment.
- The back displays an anchor representing our naval roots. Our Classes are joined as links in the chain.
- The back notes three reinforcing foundational characteristics of Integrity, Service and Resiliency of which '78 will help imbue and guide '28. The back of this card shows the relationship between these characteristics and the core values.

Core Values & Foundational Characteristics

Honor - Sense of pride and respect that comes from living up to one's ethical and moral principles. Never lie, never cheat or steal; abide by an uncompromising code of integrity; respect human dignity and respect others. It compels us to act responsibly, to fulfill our obligations and to hold ourselves and others accountable for every action.



Integrity - The quality of being honest and having strong moral principles; moral uprightness, even when no one is watching. Integrity is the foundation for your Honor.

Courage - Mental, moral and physical strength; it carries us through challenges and aids in overcoming fear. It is the inner strength that enables us to do what is right, to adhere to a higher standard of personal conduct and to make tough decisions under stress and pressure.



Resiliency - The capacity to withstand or to recover quickly from difficulties; toughness. Resiliency - and the knowledge that you can improvise, adapt and overcome - enables you to have Courage through any adversity.

Commitment - Spirit of determination and dedication. It leads to the highest order of discipline for individuals and units. It is the ingredient that enables constant dedication to the naval service and country. It inspires the unrelenting determination to succeed in every endeavor.



Service- Doing what's right for the nation, the naval service, your organization and your teammates – and putting these responsibilities above your own interests. Selfless service means that you don't make decisions or take actions that help your image or your career but hurt others or sabotage the mission. Service sparks your Commitment.
